FINAL ORDER

By Order 91-12-9, issued December 5, 1991, we directed all interested persons to show cause why we should not make final our tentative findings and conclusions that Pacific Island Aviation, Inc., is fit, willing, and able to provide service as a commuter air carrier. Interested persons were given 15 days to file objections.

No objections to Order 91-12-9 have been received.

ACCORDINGLY,

1. We find that Pacific Island Aviation, Inc., is fit, willing, and able under section 419(e) of the Federal Aviation Act to provide scheduled passenger service as a commuter air carrier;
2. The authority granted here shall become effective on the sixth (business) day after we have received the following documents:
 - (1) a copy of the company's Air Carrier Certificate and Operations Specifications from the FAA authorizing it to engage in scheduled passenger service;
 - (2) a certificate of insurance on OST Form 4520 evidencing liability insurance coverage meeting the requirements of Part 205 of our rules for all of its aircraft; and
 - (3) a statement of any changes it has undergone in its ownership, key personnel, compliance history, operating plans, or financial posture since its application was reviewed by the Department;

provided, however, that the Department may stay the effectiveness of this authority prior to that date;¹

3. We direct that, should the company propose major changes in its ownership, management, or operations, it first file with the Department information comparable to that required in section 204.4 of the Department's Regulations for certificated carriers undergoing substantial changes; and

4. We will serve a copy of this order on the persons listed in Attachment A to this order.
