GOVERNMENTAL APPROVALS

American shall obtain the following governmental approvals:

1. American requires the following approvals or consents.
 - 1.1. Statement of Authorization under 14 CFR Part 207 from the U.S. Department of Transportation to place Iberia's "IB" code on American-operated flights, listed in Annex B.
 - 1.2. Economic authority from the U.S. Department of Transportation to provide the following services:
 - a. Miami to all points in Spain listed in *Annex B*.
 - b. New York/Kennedy to all points in Spain listed in *Annex B*.
 - c. San Juan to all points in Spain listed in *Annex B*.
 - d. Chicago to all points in Spain listed in *Annex B*.
 - 1.3. License from the Spanish Ministry of Development, DGAC, ("Ministerio de Fomento") to conduct codeshare services with Iberia between the United States and Spain.
 - 1.4. ~~Approval, if required, from the U.S. Department of Transportation and each third country government prior to initiating codeshared services between the United States and the third country, via Spain.~~
2. Iberia requires the following approvals or consents.
 - 2.1. Statement of Authorization under 14 CFR Part 212 from the U.S. Department of Transportation to place American's "AA" code on Iberia-operated flights, listed in Annex B.
 - 2.2. Appropriate economic authority from the U.S. Department of Transportation in the form of a permit or exemption.
 - 2.3. Approval, if required, from the Spanish Ministry of Development, DGAC, ("Ministerio de Fomento") to conduct codeshared services with American between the United States and Spain.
 - 2.4. Approval, if required, from the Spanish Ministry of Development, DGAC, ("Ministerio de Fomento") and each third country government prior to initiating codeshared services between Spain and the third country, via the United States.

3. In connection with the Codeshared Flights between Miami and points in Central America and Mexico, approvals, if required, of pertinent third countries for codeshared services between Spain and such third countries, via the United States.
