
My company strongly agrees with NATA's opposition to the ANPRM requiring all commercial operators to collect personal information about passengers.

On-demand air charter companies should be excluded from this proposal, for as a rule they have an established relationship with their clients. No problems have been reported regarding post-accident notification for Part 135 companies. Most operators know how to immediately contact passenger relatives and associates in the event of an emergency.

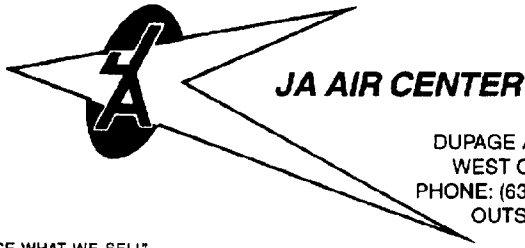
The information kept by most Part 135 operators is confidential and safety-sensitive. Releasing such data after an accident is a direct violation of the privacy of individuals utilizing charter aircraft.

Last but not least, the required paperwork, storage, etc. imposed upon aviation businesses because of this ruling would be both cumbersome and unacceptable.

Please do not include Part 135 operators in any proposed rule requiring domestic passenger manifesting.
