NOTICE OF ACTION TAKEN -- DOCKET OST-97-3178

This serves as notice to the public of the action described below, taken by the Department official indicated (no additional confirming order will be issued in this matter).

Application of United Parcel Service Co. filed 5/20/98 for:

XX Exemption from Order 96-9-16; startup deadline:

By Order 96-9-16 the Department allocated United Parcel Service six weekly all-cargo frequencies for services in the U.S.-Thailand market. That award was subject to the condition that it will expire automatically and the frequencies will revert to the Department for reallocation if they are not used for a period of 90 days. Under the terms of the order UPS' frequency allocation would expire on April 1, 1997, if UPS did not begin service by that date. UPS commenced service with one of the six frequencies by the April 1 startup date. Since then, the Department has granted extensions of the startup date for the remaining frequencies through June 30, 1998. (See Orders 97-5-6 and 98-1-6.) UPS is currently operating one frequency and seeks an exemption to the extent necessary to extend its proposed startup date to December 31, 1998, for the remaining five frequencies to December 31, 1998. UPS states that because of existing economic conditions in Thailand, the optimum date to commence its operations for the five frequencies is December 31, 1998.

Special Conditions/Remarks: The 90-day dormancy period will begin December 31, 1998, UPS' proposed new startup date for its five U.S.-Thailand all-cargo frequencies.
