Dear Ms. Archer:

ABC Charters, Inc. ("ABC") hereby requests that the Department of Transportation waive the ten-day cancellation rule (14 C.F.R. § 380.12(a)) and permit it to cancel twelve roundtrip public charter flights. The flights are scheduled to operate from July 14-August 25, 2004 between Miami, Florida and Havana/Holguin, Cuba. ABC attaches a schedule of the proposed cancellations. ABC arranged these flights in conjunction with Executive Airlines, Inc. d/b/a American Eagle, which planned to operate an ATR-72 aircraft with 62 passenger seats. ABC has enclosed the \$39.00 waiver fee.

On June 16, 2004, the Office of Foreign Assets Control ("OFAC") published new regulations that eliminate several licenses to travel to Cuba. These regulations become effective on June 30, 2004. As a result of these regulations, ABC has no alternative but to cancel twelve of the sixteen flights it previously arranged and for which it obtained Department authorization. The only flights that will operate according to the original schedule are the July 7 flight to Havana and the July 7, 14, and 21 flights to Holguin.

All passengers, who no longer qualify for travel to Cuba after June 30, 2004, will receive or have received a full refund of their roundtrip airline tickets. All passengers, who remain licensed under the new regulations in effect on June 30, 2004, will be booked on other flights to and from Cuba or, if they choose, will receive a full refund of their airline tickets.


