Dear Ms. Archer:

Marazul Charters, Inc. ("Marazul") hereby requests that the U.S. Department of Transportation waive the ten-day cancellation rule (14 C.F.R. § 380.12(a)) and permit it to cancel two, one-way public charter flights. The flights were scheduled to operate on October 24, 2005 from Miami to Havana, Cuba<sup>1</sup> and on October 28, 2005 from Havana to Miami. Marazul had arranged these flights in conjunction with Executive Airlines, Inc. d/b/a American Eagle, which planned to operate an ATR-72 aircraft with 60 passenger seats. Marazul has enclosed the \$39.00 waiver fee.

Marazul is canceling these two, one-way flights because the licensed travelers decided not to travel to Cuba at a time when a hurricane was forecast to pass over Cuba. Because the passengers cancelled their plans, there is no reason for these two flights to operate.


<sup>1</sup> Marazul filed the prospectus on August 31, 2005 identifying the October 24, 2005 flight as a "roundtrip" charter flight. Marazul had hoped to sell the Havana-Miami segment of this flight when it had filed the prospectus. Marazul, however, never opened the Havana-Miami segment and therefore did not have any passengers scheduled to return on the October 24, 2005 Havana-Miami segment.


