**MOTION OF FEDERAL EXPRESS CORPORATION  
FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT  
PURSUANT TO RULE 39**

Federal Express Corporation (Federal Express) hereby submits this motion to withhold from public disclosure certain information contained in its Form 41, Schedule B-7, Airframe and Aircraft Engine Acquisitions and Retirements Report for the quarter ending March 31, 1997, submitted herewith under seal pursuant to Rule 39 of the Rules of Practice of the Department of Transportation (the Department).<sup>1/</sup>

By letter dated August 23, 1994 to counsel for Delta Air Lines, Inc. (Delta) from Mr. James W. Mitchell, former Director, Office of Airline Statistics,

Research and Special Programs Administration (RSPA), the Department determined that the financial information contained in air carrier Schedule B-7 and Schedule B-43 reports is confidential and contains competitively-sensitive data, and that withholding such confidential data from public disclosure is warranted by, and consistent with, Exemptions 3 and 4 of the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3) and (4)). In that decision, the Department has ruled that the confidential data contained in a carrier's Schedule B-7 and B-43 reports will be withheld from public disclosure for a period of ten (10) years from the date on which it is filed. The foregoing ruling applies with equal validity to Federal Express' Schedule B-7 Report for the quarter ended March 31, 1997.

WHEREFORE, Federal Express respectfully moves the Department to withhold the financial information contained in its Schedule B-7 Report for the quarter ended March 31, 1997, filed concurrently herewith under seal, from public disclosure for a period of ten (10) years, through March 31, 2007, pursuant to Rule 39 of the Rules of Practice.
