
Dear Ms. Senese:

In our application submitted on February 3, 2004, we requested a limited dormancy waiver for two Miami-Medellin weekly frequencies to cover the period until June 15, 2004, when American will begin operating daily Miami-Medellin service.

On February 5, 2004, the Department issued an Amendment to Notice of Action Taken in OST-2003-15021 and OST-1999-6210 with respect to the Atlanta-Buenos Aires dormancy waiver granted to Delta Air Lines, Inc. on January 30, 2004. By that Amendment, Delta in effect is given a two-week cushion - from its announced start date of December 1 until to December 15 - to use its frequencies.

In these circumstances, American requests similar treatment of its Miami-Medellin application, so that our dormancy waiver is granted until June 30, 2004. As we stated in our polling letter submitted in the captioned dockets on February 4, 2004, we request expedited approval.


