
MOTION OF AMERICAN EAGLE AIRLINES, INC.  
FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT UNDER RULE 12

American Eagle Airlines, Inc., under 14 CFR 302.12, hereby moves that the enclosed Schedule B-43 to its Form 41 report for the year ended December 31, 2003 be accorded confidential treatment and be withheld from public disclosure. The information for which confidential treatment is requested pertains to American Eagle's airframes and aircraft engine acquisitions and retirements. As provided in Rule 12, this information is in a sealed enveloped marked "Confidential Treatment Requested Under Rule 12."

On June 5, 1995, by letter of James W. Mitchell, Director, Office of Airline Statistics, the Department granted confidential treatment for a 10-year period to similar data filed by American Airlines, Inc. For the reasons stated in Mr. Mitchell's letter, the Department should also grant confidential treatment for 10 years to American Eagle's data.

WHEREFORE, American Eagle moves that the schedules submitted under seal with this motion be withheld from public disclosure under Rule 12 for a period of 10 years.
