APPLICATION OF AMERICAN AIRLINES, INC. FOR RENEWAL
OF CERTIFICATE FOR ROUTE 804

American Airlines, Inc., under 49 USC 41101 and 14 CFR Part 377, hereby applies for renewal of its certificate for Route 804, authorizing scheduled foreign air transportation of persons, property and mail between Miami, Florida and Medellin, Colombia. This authority was initially granted by Order 2001-5-26, May 18, 2001.

In filing this application, American invokes the automatic extension provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, 5 USC 558(c), as implemented by 14 CFR Part 377. The subject authority would expire on May 18, 2006 absent this renewal application, which is timely under 14 CFR 377.10(c)(1) since it is filed more than 180 days in advance of the expiration date.

American requests that this application be processed using expedited procedures under 14 CFR 302.207. In support of its application, American respectfully states as follows.

1. American is a Delaware corporation with its principal office at 4330 Amon Carter Boulevard, Ft. Worth, Texas 76155.

2. American is a citizen of the United States within the meaning of 49 USC 40102(a)(15); its president and two-thirds of more of its board of directors and other managing officers are such citizens; and at least 75 percent of its voting stock is owned or controlled by persons who are such citizens.

3. American presently engages in scheduled air transportation and foreign air transportation of persons, property, and mail pursuant to certificates of public convenience and necessity and exemptions issued under the Federal aviation statute.


4. American is fit, willing, and able to provide the air transportation covered by this application and to conform to the provisions of the statute and of the rules, regulations, and requirements issued by the Department.

OPENING ARGUMENT

5. American has continuously operated nonstop service between Miami and Medellin since 2001. American presently operates one daily roundtrip using 188-seat B757 aircraft (22C/166Y).

6. American is providing important air services for passengers and shippers between Miami and Medellin, and renewal is clearly in the public interest. American requests that the subject authority be renewed for a period of at least five years, consistent with the Department's policy as set forth in 14 CFR 399.120.


