

Passenger Manifest Information Compliance Statement

The following describes Jet Aviation Business Jets AG (JBJA) compliance with 14 CFR Part 243.

JBJA generally operates midsize business jets, but in some cases aircraft are operated, which have a design seating capacity of 60 or more, although equipped with only a small number of seats. Therefore JBJA must have a plan to collect and transmit information about US citizen passengers to the US government within 3 hours of learning of an aviation disaster involving a covered flight segment operated by JBJA.

JBJA intends to comply with the specified manifest requirements by requesting its U.S. citizen passengers to complete a pre-printed information form (see attachment). This form will be made available to all passengers:

- as attachment to the charter contract, and
- at the airport of departure, usually through the cabin crew member first meeting the passengers

The form will indicate that passenger name information is required and that a contact name and telephone may be provided optionally. When the necessity arises (i.e. in the event of an "aviation disaster"), JBJA will transmit this information to the U.S. Department of State, Managing Director of Overseas Citizen Services, Bureau of Consular Affairs, and, upon request, to the National Transportation Safety Board by fax or email.

Within JBJA, the Post Holder Ground Operations will be responsible to collect and transmit the above information. The communication may be established at any given time through the JBJA dispatch (telephone +41 58 158 87 87).

Passenger information will not be retained after the flight or series of flights is completed and the concerned passengers have disembarked the aircraft.
