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**APPLICATION OF
JETBLUE AIRWAYS CORPORATION FOR RENEWAL OF EXEMPTION
(JFK TO SDQ AND JFK TO STI)**

JetBlue Airways Corporation (hereinafter "JetBlue") respectfully requests the Department of Transportation to renew its exemption granted in Docket OST- 2004-17265, as renewed by NOAT dated January 25, 2006, pending issuance of permanent certificate authority pursuant to both DOT's Notice issue in Docket OST-2005-22228 and JetBlue's certificate application originally requested in Docket OST-2004-17264, to allow JetBlue Airways to continue to operate scheduled combination service between the United States (John F. Kennedy International Airport) and the Dominican Republic, (Santa Domingo (SDQ) and Santiago (STI))¹.

¹ JetBlue herewith invokes the provisions of 5 U.S.C. § 558(c) to continue operations under its existing authority until final action has been taken on its request for renewal.

JetBlue requests that the exemption be granted for a period of two (2) years or until the Department takes final action on its certificate application filed with Docket OST-2004-17264 on March 3, 2004, for the issuance of a certificate of public convenience and necessity for foreign combination service.


In support of its application JetBlue states as follows:

1. JetBlue is a Delaware corporation with its principal office located at 118-29 Queens Blvd., Forest Hills, NY 11375.
2. JetBlue is a citizen as defined by 49 U.S.C Section 40102 (a) (15) (c), as amended, and is fit, willing and able to provide the services contemplated by this exemption application. JetBlue holds a Certificate for Public Convenience and Necessity for Interstate Air Transportation issued on February 4, 2000, Order 2000-2-7 (see DOT Docket 99-5616). The Department has issued JetBlue certificate authority for foreign air transportation in Docket OST-27790, Order 2007-4-27 and exemption authority for foreign air transportation in Docket OST-2004-17265 and OST-2004-18796.
3. The exemption requested herein is for the transportation of persons, property and mail, in combination service, between JFK Airport and Santo Domingo, DR and between JFK Airport and Santiago, DR. JetBlue operates these routes with Stage 3 compliant airbus A-320 aircraft, the same aircraft it presently operates to San Juan, Puerto Rico. JetBlue's A-320 aircraft are configured to carry 156 customers.
4. JetBlue's operations are fully consistent with the July 22, 1996 Bilateral Air Transportation Agreement between the United States and the Dominican Republic.
5. JetBlue's application for an exemption poses no environmental or energy issue and all flights will be operated with Stage 3 aircraft. Approval of this application

will not result in the near-term consumption of ten (10) million or more gallons of fuel.

Wherefore, JetBlue respectfully requests the granting of a renewal of exemption permitting it to continue to engage in the carriage of persons, property and mail in combination service between the United States and the Dominican Republic as set forth herein.

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
